This past year we launched our Wrapped in Love closet. Clothing insecurity is a hidden crisis for children nationwide. More than 20 million American children are at risk of being clothing insecure. Not having appropriate clothing harms a child's health, safety, and self-esteem, factors known to impact their academic performance and long-term success.

We believe all children should have what they need at home, school, and play. Our Wrapped in Love closet provides foster, adoptive, kinship, and families in need the opportunity to shop for new or likenew clothing items, toys, and books, all free of charge.

2023 marks eight years of serving the community. As we evolve, our 'Why' remains unchanged - equipping, connecting, and advocating for our most vulnerable – our children and young adults.

Duffel Bags of Hope

Hi, I'm Sheila. We recently reached out to Because One Matters to request three of their duffel bags because we had received a call from DFACS that three children were being placed in our home.

We called Because One Matters at around 5:30 PM in the evening – the kids had not yet arrived. They asked specific questions about each of the kids – their sizes, the ages, gender, their favorite colors – because they wanted to pack a duffel bag specific for each child. Well the kids hadn't arrived yet, so we didn't have the sizes but I told them that I would call them back and let them know as soon as they arrived.

When the kids arrived, we were unable to get the sizes right away because they were so traumatized and devastated at that point. But long story short, a little while later, we were able to get the sizes and call Because One Matters They showed up the same night at our doorstep with three duffel bags filled with outfits, toiletries, books and a bear for each child.

I have to say the most impactful part of the process was while we were waiting for Because One Matters to arrive, one of the kids – the oldest girl – woke up crying because she missed her bear that her mom had given her and she hadn't been able to bring it with her. In her duffel bag was a beautiful, colorful bear that I was able to give to her. Just to see the smile on her face, to be able to smile through the tears, it just meant a lot. It really meant a lot.

All the kids also received a sleeping bag – so the next night they were able to use the sleeping bags for a movie, so it was a fun time.

I just want to say thank you, thank you. Thank you, Because One Matters for easing the transition for these three kids and all that you've done for all the kids over the last seven years. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.

Making a Difference — at home Home for the Holidays Program

2022 marks the sixth year for our Home for the Holidays (H4H) program. The H4H program was created for foster youth participating in the Independent Living program through Youth Empowerment Success Services (YESS) to experience Thanksgiving and Christmas in their home by providing full-course meals, Christmas trees with decorations, and gifts.

Many of these young adults do not have families to share the holidays. Our H4H mission is to ensure each young adult in our program experiences a memorable holiday in their own home.

In the early years, we had volunteers gather in a commercial kitchen the nights before Thanksgiving and Christmas, to prepare the meals. In 2019, the youth wanted to be a part of making their own Thanksgiving meal. So, the men from Lawrenceville-Duluth Alumni Chapter (LDAC) of the Kappa Alpha PSI Fraternity, Inc., along with Chef Melissa from Morsels by Melissa, came together an helped these young adults prepare a fabulous Thanksgiving meal. The LDAC men also mentored some of the young men during the meal preparation. This was such a success that we decided to do it again in 2020, but COVID happened.

With the pandemic still going on during the Thanksgiving and Christmas of 2020, we had to think of a safe way to serve these young adults, and that is when Chef Michelle from 2 Girls 'n a Grill stepped up and offered to prepare all the meals. Chef Michelle is still preparing the meals.

As the program continues to grow and evolve, we're thrilled to have provided 171 meals with your help. Last year, in addition to delivering full-course meals for both holidays, and Christmas gifts, to the youth in the ILP Program, we also provided Christmas gifts to the youth in YESS' Rapid Rehousing Program. We are thankful to Ebony, the Founder & CEO of YESS, for this partnership. We are extra thankful to our Program Director, Ms. Daniels, for her continued dedication and leadership of Home for the Holidays.
